Get Ready, Get Set.....VOTE!

Summer is in full swing at Skookum and everyone is busier than ever. The July calendar is out and there is barely a day that an event is not scheduled. And, before you know it, it will be time for the Camelot and Skookum Annual Meetings.

This year SROA (Skookum Rendezvous Owners Association) and CSOA (Camelot Shores Owners Association) will launch their first official online electronic election through **electionbuddy**. The system has been thoroughly tested and has proven itself to deliver a highly secure, accurate and easy to use interactive method to cast your votes. Did you know that 95 % of our association members use electronic ballot voting? And, that percentage equals a savings to the budget of over \$600.00 from previous annual meeting costs. That is pretty impressive.....

So what can you do to maximize the savings? You can choose any one of your three options to cast your vote: 1) Electronic Email Ballot 2) Cast your Ballot in Person 3) Return Your Proxy.

For option 1) keep your eye on your email and for options 2) & 3), keep your eye on the USPS mail. Remember to follow all instructions, and don't forget to check for the deadlines. If you have questions please do not hesitate to contact the association office. The election committee extends a thank you to all who have participated in the test these last few months.

Firehouse Chat—Craig Shantz



June was a busy month for POFD6 and Skookum Rendezvous. At the June HOA board meeting, Chief Arnold spoke about the progress with the new station. Paper work is being submitted with the county, and he hopes to have the first phase, a shop warehouse, in place before the snow flies. Other topics included the County EMS System, Firewise, and the fund-raising event scheduled for the End of July at Skookum.

A **Firewise** presentation was given by our Skookum Firefighters on June 14th. We appreciated the attendance and questions on how to keep park residences safe in the case of a wildfire. This was followed by a short training with the park's new fire hose cart, purchased with a WDNR (Washington Department of Natural Resources) grant. The cart has 500 feet of hose and hooks up to park hydrants. This gives park residents the ability and opportunity to take defensive measures in the event of a fire.



June 15th and 17th were clean up days. Fire district firefighters did a little limb trimming and chipping with equipment bought through another WDNR grant awarded to the district. In the two days, the equivalent of 8 pickup loads of vegetation were chipped and shredded. It was great to use the new equipment.

June 24th, crews participated in the Newport Rodeo parade. It was a lot of fun and gave us a chance to say high to the folks we serve. We also responded to a number of emergency calls within the county.

July will be busy with the Fourth of July parades, HOA visits, a chipper day at Bead Lake and the Greggs Rd. communities, and of course the Skookum fund raiser.

The fire engine E61 and pickup C62 you have seen in the lot across from the lodge, will be there on a temporary basis this summer. It affords us a means of having the equipment close for quicker responses to emergencies. The reason it is not out on the fire district property with water tender 62, is for security reasons. We appreciate the park allowing them to be there.

Lastly, POFD6 will be having an **Open House BBQ on July 15th, between 10am and 2pm.** Please mark your calendars to enjoy a hamburger and hot dog and meet all of your district firefighters.

We would like to thank all the residents of Skookum Rendezvous for their hospitality and support. It takes a team to run and support a fire agency. We feel Skookum is part of that team. Be Safe and Be Firewise this summer.
