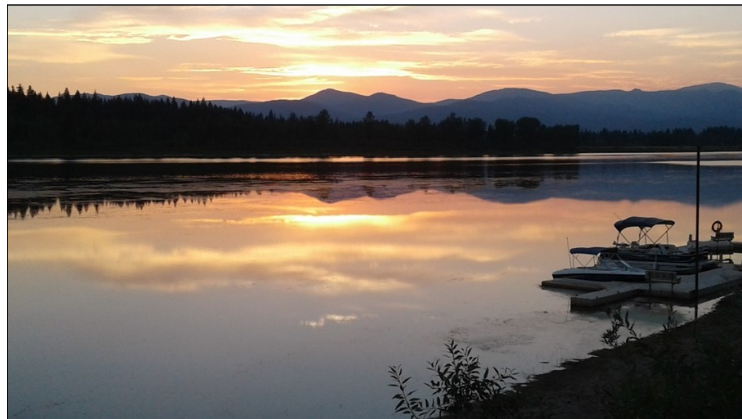
Rest assured the new board is working hard to finalize a plan for the winter snow removal to ensure our winter residents will have continued access to the resort and facilities.

Answers to common questions about the Lenora Water and Sewer District and how it operates are listed below:

How is the Lenora Water and Sewer District governed? The Board of Commissioners is currently comprised of three commissioners: Mike Conway, Mike Wenger and Gary Robertson.

How long is the term of a commissioner? Six years, starting on January 1, following their election.

Who may serve as a commissioner? Only a registered voter within the LSW District and who owns property within the District may file as a candidate for a district commissioner.

Who may vote during a commissioner election? Only a registered voter of Pend Oreille County, WA and who owns property within the District may vote to elect a person as a commissioner. (Continued on pg 5)
