

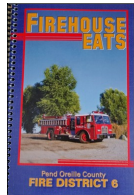
Firehouse Chat—Craig Shantz



For those of you here already, "Welcome Back", and for those still enroute, have a safe trip on your return to Skookum! Your Fire District has been busy in your absence this Winter. Several of us obtained our certification in Wildland Firefighting in preparation for this year's fire season. Our organization continues to add EMTs with yet another firefighter successfully completing that course. Firefighters also attended classes at the North Idaho Emergency Services Academy in early April, completing advanced Wildland fire, EMT, and rope rescues.

We responded on a multitude of medical calls, and several structure fires, the most recent in Oldtown, where 8 fire districts and departments responded for mutual aid.

Some of you may be wondering about the progress of Station 62, and we are excited to tell you that progress is being made with the help of Sam Castro, the County Public Works Director. We hope to have the structure up this summer.



For those of you who will be at Skookum on May 30th, we would like for you to mark your calendars for the "Cook the Cookbook" event. As a department fundraiser, we have compiled and printed a "Firehouse Eats" cookbook of our favorite recipes.
