Firehouse Chat with Diane Shantz!



The Summer season is upon us and with that brings new group of owners to the Skookum Community. Every year I like to let the new owners know, and remind owners who have been here awhile information that is important to be aware of.

South Pend Oreille Fire and Rescue is a <u>volunteer</u> Fire District supplemented with 9 paid career firefighters/EMts and a roster of 53 dedicated volunteers to respond to your fire or medical emergency. The District covers over 240 square miles, including the City of Newport, and responds out of 9 Fire Stations located throughout our service area. At this time only 1 station is staffed fully 24/7 and that is the Diamond Lake Station on Highway 2. Be aware you are in a rural area with only a level 4 trauma hospital. Response times to your emergency will vary depending on where the paid staff and volunteers are responding from.

The Skookum Community is fortunate to have the Skookum Station, Station 62, which is owned by the Fire District, within your neighborhood. Again, it is a volunteer station, with an Engine, Tender, and Brush truck stationed within the building. We also have an office which is only occupied should one of our volunteers be on the property. Also remember it is important to ALWAYS call 911 first in the event of any emergency, instead of coming to the fire station for help. This saves valuable time and ensures that all appropriate resources and personnel are dispatched in a timely manner.

The fire station also has a helicopter landing zone on the west side of the station. In the event of a stroke, heart attack, or major trauma, the possibility of being transported by helicopter is high. If you don't already have LifeFlight insurance, you are urged to obtain it at an extremely low cost of \$85.00 a year, which covers all family members residing in the household. It is a small amount to cover the very expensive helicopter transport you may need. For further information go to www.lifeflight.org

Are you confident that first responders can locate your lot in an event of an emergency? Finding your lot, especially at night, can be difficult unless you have an unobstructed, clearly visible reflective sign with your address (not your lot number) on it. If you would like to obtain a reflective

sign, go to www.spofr.org scroll to the bottom of the home page for information on how to obtain one through the fire department.

Do you know when you can legally burn and have open campfires? To easily find out, call 1-800-323-BURN. Remember burning in a burn barrel is illegal everywhere in Washington, and you can burn only natural vegetation. Never leave a fire unattended, and always have a water source nearby.

As we head towards wildfire season, it is imperative that you clear all sources of fire fuels from your property, especially pine needles and dry weeds. For those living along the creek with pine trees, remember to clear you roofs of your park homes, trailers, and sheds. Embers from a wildfire can travel up to 5 miles. Please do your part to keep the Skookum Community safe this summer.

Do you know you can be alerted of an emergency, road closure, or other important information in Pend Oreille County by subscribing to NIXLE alerts on your smart phone? Text your zipcode to 888777 for mobile alerts. You can go to www.nixle.com for additional information.

Lastly, with every season comes change. Craig and I have lived within the Skookum Community as property owners and then resident firefighters/EMTs since 2008. The time has come for us to hang up our gear and start a new adventure elsewhere. It has been a privilege and an honor to serve this Community. We are forever grateful for the support we received during our fund raising events over the years and the valuable and lifesaving equipment we were able to purchase for the fire district. The Skookum Community has helped raise well over \$50,000. Never doubt what you can do as a Community when you all work together.

Things To Do This Summer!

Cusick River's Edge Park

An easy one-mile interpretive walking trail, a covered pavilion with benches and BBQs for a picnic, a boat launch, skateboard park, plenty of parking, and many fantastic views of the Pend Oreille River await at this hidden gem just a few miles from Skookum! Also available is a 2-mile paved, dedicated river walk between Cusick and Usk. Park at the Cusick River's Edge Park and walk as far as you like before returning. Newly installed benches are available to sit and enjoy the open river view. This trail does parallel River Road, but the walking lane is clearly marked and there is usually very little vehicle traffic going by. The trail begins at the Cusick VFW adjacent to the park and goes all the way to the Usk Store.

We have used and enjoyed this park for years and rarely see many others there, except for the boat launch, which gets proper use. There is a kiosk fee station to pay for the use of the boat launch and trailer parking. We usually leave something in the fee box for the use of the park even though it is free. We want to make sure they have the funds to maintain the upkeep and cleanliness that we enjoy!

So, bring water and some snacks or lunch, get some exercise, and spend a few peaceful hours with a different view of the river! And don't forget your binoculars and or cameras as there is usually plenty of wildlife, usually birds, not to mention great views of the mountains to the east. Access the parking area by turning off 1st Avenue onto Monument Way behind the Cusick fire station. Go to this website (https://selkirkloop.org/city/cusick-wa/), zoom in on the map and look for the boat launch on Monument Way. Enjoy!

Skookum Boat Launch Dock

Albani Falls Dam!

Did you know that, in addition to the Albani Falls Dam visitors center on highway 2, there is also a nice little park below that area with great views of the river, dam and railroad bridge crossing the river! Shade trees and picnic benches make for a nice outing! And there is also access to views on the south side of the dam, as well. Turn east on 4th Street S off of hwy 41



in Old Town, which becomes Albani Cove Rd as it descends down to Albany Cove Park. At 2.1 miles, there is a fork in Albani Cove Rd, the left fork taking you down to a small, gravel parking area where a short walk will take you to the south side of the dam. Or you can continue on the right fork, which will take you down to Albani Cove Park, an Army Corps of Engineers facility with parking, a swimming beach, picnic area, boat launch, and a campground for tents and RVs, and more views of the railroad bridge and the river!
